

REPORT OF THE STUDIES COMMITTEE

to the

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

May 15, 1984

The Studies Committee of the Legislative Council met at 9:25 a.m. in Committee Room 22 of the State House to review the requests for interim studies and submits the following report:

1. That the mandated 1984 interim study proposals, which list is attached, be approved.
2. That the Speaker of the House, the House majority and minority leaders and the Senate majority and minority leaders will appoint the members of the Comparable Worth Steering Committee and the Drunk Driving Study Committee with the approval of the Legislative Council.
3. That per diem and expenses for members of the Drunk Driving Study Committee be made as provided in section 2.12 from funds available under section 2.12.
4. That the four members associated with the private sector nonprofit corporation established pursuant to Senate File 2361 to be members of the Agriculture, Food and Energy Demonstration Center Study Committee be appointed by and subject to the approval of the Legislative Council if Senate File 2361 is signed by the Governor and becomes law.
5. That an Export Market-Trade Center Study Committee be established to review the export market and trade center concept within the scope of the study to be developed by the Studies Committee and the Legislative Council.
6. That individual requests for studies and resolutions requesting studies be reviewed by the Studies Committee at its next meeting.

The Service Committee met on May 14, 1984 and makes the following recommendations to the Legislative Council:

1. That Mr. Craig Jontz be employed by the Legislative Service Bureau as an Attorney I at Pay Grade 29, Step 1.
2. That Ms. Autumn McGrean be employed by the Legislative Service Bureau as a Word Processor I at Pay Grade 13, Step 1.
3. That the Computer Committee be authorized to initiate an advertising and interviewing process for employment of a systems manager for the legislative computer system. The Computer Committee will report the results of this process to the Service Committee and the Legislative Council in June.
4. That the Legislative Fiscal Bureau be allowed to expend unencumbered moneys from funds appropriated to it for the 1983-1984 fiscal year for reprogramming costs in connection with changes being made in the State Comptroller's Budget Book in order to access information from the State Comptroller's office during the 1985 legislative session.
