MADAM PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on April 19, 2024, **passed** the following bill in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

Senate File 2443, a bill for an act relating to state government and finances, including by making, modifying, limiting, or reducing appropriations, distributions, or transfers, authorizing expenditure of unappropriated moneys in special funds, providing for properly related matters including the state government efficiency review committee and teacher salary supplement district cost per pupil calculations, making corrections, and including effective date, applicability, and retroactive applicability provisions.

ALSO: That the House has on April 19, 2024, **adopted** the conference committee report **and passed** Senate File 2109, a bill for an act relating to the driving privileges of persons under eighteen years of age, and making penalties applicable.

ALSO: That the House has on April 19, 2024, **refused to concur** in the Senate amendment to the House amendment to the following bill in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

Senate File 2395, a bill for an act relating to the opioid settlement fund, including appropriations of the moneys in the fund, and providing an effective date.

# SENATE BILLS APPROVED AND VETOED AFTER ADJOURNMENT

### SENATE BILLS APPROVED

<u>Senate File 345</u>—Relating to the regulation of certain tobacco products, providing penalties, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 17, 2024.

<u>Senate File 461</u> –To include veterans in the small business linked investments program. Approved May 8, 2024.

<u>Senate File 477</u>–Relating to health care, including the licensure of internationally trained physicians and electronic protected health information, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 3, 2024.

Senate File 574—Relating to programs administered by the economic development authority by establishing the economic growth attraction program, modifying the certified site and high-quality jobs programs, making appropriations, providing penalties, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 1, 2024. Correction approved May 10, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2071</u>–Relating to bingo games, including the price to play and the value of merchandise prizes. Approved May 1, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2109</u>—Relating to the driving privileges of persons under eighteen years of age, and making penalties applicable. Approved May 17, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2251</u>—Relating to eligibility for pregnant women and infants under the Medicaid program, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 8, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2268</u>—Relating to assistance animals and service animals, including reasonable accommodations for housing and requirements for findings of disabilities. Approved May 1, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2289</u>—Relating to economic development and energy shortages under the purview of the economic development authority and governor, and providing penalties. Approved May 17, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2368</u>–Relating to education, including by modifying provisions related to the sale of real property by school districts, charter school and open enrollment funding, and the participation in school activities by students enrolled in charter schools. Approved May 17, 2024.

Senate File 2370—Concerning the executive branch rulemaking process and other agency functions and related matters. Approved May 17, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2385</u>—Relating to boards, commissions, committees, councils, and other entities of state government, and including effective date and transition provisions. Approved May 17, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2391</u>–Prohibiting the misbranding of certain food products, and providing penalties. Approved May 15, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2405</u>—Modifying provisions related to the distribution formula for general state financial aid to community colleges and including applicability provisions. Approved May 8, 2024.

Senate File 2411—Relating to work-based learning, including by repealing provisions related to regional industry sector partnerships and the statewide work-based learning intermediary network, establishing the workforce opportunity fund within the department of workforce development, modifying provisions related to career and technical education, student teacher requirements for students with substitute teaching or para-educator experience, the unemployment compensation reserve fund, and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship program, making appropriations, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 16, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2421</u>–Relating to and making appropriations involving state government entities associated with agriculture, natural resources, and environmental protection, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 9, 2024.

Senate File 2422—Relating to transportation and other infrastructure-related appropriations to the department of transportation, including allocation and use of moneys from the road use tax fund and the primary road fund. Approved May 9, 2024.

Senate File 2423–Relating to snowmobile registrations and nonresident user permits, providing fees, and making penalties applicable. Approved May 1, 2024.

Senate File 2430–Relating to the correction and substitution of death certificates. Approved May 8, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2432</u>—Relating to and making appropriations for the economic development of the state, including to the economic development authority, the Iowa finance authority, the public employment relations board, the department of workforce development, and the state board of regents and certain regents institutions. Approved May 9, 2024.

Senate File 2433—Relating to and making appropriations for state government administration and regulation, including the department of administrative services, auditor of state, ethics and campaign disclosure board, offices of governor and lieutenant governor, department of inspections, appeals, and licensing, department of insurance and financial services, department of management, Iowa public employees' retirement system, public information board, department of revenue, secretary of state, treasurer of state, and utilities board. Approved May 9, 2024.

Senate File 2435—Relating to and making appropriations to the education system, including the funding and operation of the department for the blind, department of education, and state board of regents; modifying provisions related to compulsory education, open enrollment, the state board of regents presidential search committee, the Iowa tuition grants program, and the Iowa dyslexia board; establishing restrictions related to diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts of institutions of higher education governed by the state board of regents; providing penalties; and including effective date and applicability provisions. Approved May 9, 2024.

<u>Senate File 2436</u>—Relating to and making appropriations to the judicial branch, including by modifying the judicial retirement fund, and including effective date provisions. Approved May 9, 2024.

Senate File 2442—Relating to state and local finances by modifying individual and alternate income tax rates, withholding credits, franchise tax deductions, methodologies for determining property taxes, and property tax assessment limitations, changing methods of determining compensation of county officials, making contingent transfers from the taxpayer relief fund, and making corrections, and including effective date and applicability provisions. Approved May 1, 2024.

Dear Governor Reynolds:

Senate File 574 was considered by the House and Senate this past legislative session. During the process, the House amended the bill and voted to approve the bill as amended. This action is entered in H.J. 532. The Senate received the bill and the House amendments as entered in S.J. 562. The House amendments were incorporated as amendment S-5057.

The Senate concurred with amendment S-5057 as entered in S.J. 462. The Senate then passed Senate File 574 as amended by S-5057 as entered in S.J. 838.

On April 29, 2024, the bill was reported as "correctly enrolled, signed by President and Speaker, and sent to Governor." The bill, as presented, was then signed into law on May 1, 2024.

On May 7, 2024, it was brought to my attention that due to a clerical error, not all of amendment  $\underline{S-5057}$  was incorporated into the bill (see attached page explaining the error).

To correct this error and to present you with an accurate version of the bill for your consideration as contemplated in Article III, section 16 of Iowa's Constitution, the bill was once again engrossed, enrolled, and the required signatures obtained as required by Article III, section 15 of Iowa's Constitution. This correct version of the bill contains all of amendment  $\underline{S-5057}$ .

The legislative branch believes this is the most transparent method of resolving the issue and is a correct and accurate reflection of the votes of the House and Senate as required under Article III, section 17 of Iowa's Constitution.

  - A. Created emergency rulemaking powers for the Economic Development Authority (page 3, line 33 through page 4, line 9).
  - B. Created an Effective Date for Division I of the bill (page 4, lines 10-11).
  - C. Created a new Division II of the bill (starting on page 4, line 12, through page 4, line 33).
  - D. Created another Effective Date for Division II of the bill (page 4, lines 34 and 35).
- 2. During the engrossing/enrollment process, a clerical error occurred that resulted in the failure to include page 3, line 33 through page 4, line 11 (which is A and B above) in the bill. The remaining part of Operation 41 (C and D above) and the remaining operations of Amendment  $\underline{S-5057}$  all were included in the bill.
