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INDEXER'S PREFATORY NOTE

This index is primarily the index of 1962 Code with the additions and deletions required to include the Acts of the 60th, 60th Extra, and 61st General Assemblies. Two substantial changes have been made however.

The 60th General Assembly enacted a new Probate Code, repealing and recodifying the statutes relating to the subject. The index to the Probate Code was prepared by Professor N. William Hines of the University of Iowa College of Law at the request of the Iowa Bar Association. This index is found under the main heading, PROBATE CODE, within the index volume.

The 61st General Assembly enacted the Uniform Commercial Code, which takes effect July 1, 1966. The index reflects the changes made by the Commercial Code, and was largely adopted from the index found in the Uniform Act, from which the Iowa Commercial Code was adopted. The index to the Uniform Commercial Code appears under the heading, UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE, within the index volume.

Errors in the index are bound to occur. In an effort to improve the index, please bring errors to the attention of the Code Editor so that they may be corrected.
